Snow Routes

During snowstorm events, the key focus of The Town of Frederick is to ensure that street access is made available to accommodate the travel of emergency vehicles, scheduled collectors, and the individual safety of our residents. When three or more inches of non-drifted snow has fallen, or enough snow or sleet has collected to cause a solid coating of ice on the streets, we will dispatch Public Works personnel to plow the designated Emergency Snow Routes. If homes or businesses are located on a Snow Route, it is requested that vehicles parked on the Snow Routes be relocated, so that snow plows can effectively clear the streets without barricading vehicles with snow. Do not shovel snow from your driveways and sidewalks into the streets. This causes problems with damming drainage patterns on you street, which in turn will cause heavy icing.
