The Safe Routes to Schools project was completed in August giving students in the Savannah, Angel View, Carriage Hills and Prairie Greens neighborhoods the option to walk to school safely.

Town election officials rallied during the pandemic to provide a safe and fair election. Voter participation made the April election record-setting, with 2,511 ballots, the most in any Town of Frederick election to date!

Mark your calendars and get ready for the annual Tree Sale! Starting February 1, take advantage of the town's bulk order and purchase trees at a deep discount. We have a wide variety of trees to choose from that are low to moderately low water demand. There are 19 species available, ranging from \$75 to \$110 each. That's almost half of what you would pay at a nursery! Trees provide shade in the summertime and a layer of protection from winter winds. To add beauty to your landscaping, reduce your carbon footprint and lower your utility bills, follow these steps:

- Starting Monday, February 1, place your order at FrederickCO.gov/Trees.
- Receive your order confirmation and pay in person or over the phone by April 1.
- Come and get your tree at Public Works in April. We'll let you know the pick-up dates.
- Celebrate Arbor Day on April 30!

The Town of Frederick and Board of Trustees asked for and received feedback from local businesses to better understand the hardships and financial struggles impacting their livelihoods due to the pandemic and State of Colorado mandated restrictions. As elected officials and leaders, we know a healthy business community builds a vibrant community. We believe it is time to extend a lifeline to business owners needing help to recover, be viable in the long run and continue to call Frederick home.

On December 15, 2020, The Board of Trustees authorized the Frederick Business Recovery Plan, a two-month grant program to support brick-and-mortar businesses in the Town of Frederick affected by the COVID-19 restrictions dated November 20, 2020. The Town has allocated \$200,000 in funds from the Oil Royalty Trust Fund as defined in Municipal Code Section 4-59. The Board of Trustees for the Town of Frederick designates the Frederick Oil Royalty Trust Fund to be used to support the Frederick High School Scholarship Program, community organization grants, economic development programs and those governmental purposes as the Board may be designated from time to time.
