BUSINESS RECOVERY PLAN

There is still time to apply for the Frederick Business Recovery Plan, a grant program to support brick-and-mortar businesses in the Town of Frederick. The Town has allocated \$200,000 in funds from the Oil Royalty Trust Fund as defined in Municipal Code Section 4-59. If your business has experienced financial hardship due to closures resulting from the COVID-19 restrictions set in place on November 20, 2020, apply for a grant at FrederickCO.gov/BusinessRecoveryPlan.

DETECTIVE CORNER

Scams, scams, everywhere scams! Reports of internet and phone scams are on the rise with the Frederick Police Department. There are numerous types of internet and phone scams out there, but they all have one thing in common – scammers want your money. Our Detectives have some insights about the telltale signs and sneaky practices scammers use to steal your funds.

Avoid scams with these four tips:

- Never provide personal information over the phone or internet to someone you don’t know.
- Never purchase gift cards and then provide the numbers on the cards to anyone over the phone or internet. Do not send or wire money!
- Never respond to unsolicited emails, phone calls or text messages involving employment opportunities.
- Government entities will never request financial information or gift card numbers over the phone.

BUDGET HIGHLIGHTS

We received great feedback from the community about the presentation of the Town's 2021 budget! As a result, we are currently working with a Frederick resident to update our budget presentations to provide clear, detailed information from a local's perspective. In the meantime, here are some of the highlights of the 2021 budget:

- Public safety is our priority! From the success of voter-approved 2A in 2019, the additional 1% sales tax generated in 2021 will enable us to add one full-time Commander, two full-time Police Officers, replacement of vehicles, plus more safety training and equipment.
- Parks, open space and trails projects include improvements at Centennial Park, Summit View Estates, shelter and irrigation improvements at Crist Park, trail improvements at Frederick Way and an open space land purchase.
- The 2021 budget includes a continuation of funding for the Town's pavement maintenance and alleyway improvement program, stormwater improvements in Countryside and a new speed light program.
- Other projects include upgrading our financial software, replacing Public Work vehicles and hiring additional full-time staffing across many departments. Enhancements at Bella Rosa Golf Course include a new maintenance facility, on-course shelter, equipment and path improvements.

By the end of 2021, the Town is projected to have over \$27 million in unreserved funds across all fund types. The Town boasts an AA rating from Standard & Poor's, the world's leading provider of credit ratings. Learn more about the Finance Department and view the Town's budget at FrederickCO.gov/Budget.
