SPRING CLEAN UP DAYS

The Landfill Voucher Program is back for 2021. In April, Town of Frederick residents can use a voucher for one free trip to the Front Range Landfill (1830 Weld County Road 5, Erie, CO 80516). Pick up your official voucher at the Administrative Services building (311 Fifth St.) between 9 am to 4 pm, starting Monday, March 15. Seniors 65 and over who don't have the means to take their items to the landfill can call Public Works at 720.382.5800 (before April 23) to request a curbside pickup. Do you have electronics to recycle? Public Works is offering free electronics recycling on April 28, 29, 30, and May 1. Drop-off times vary, and each household can bring up to five electronic items to recycle. How about tree limb disposal? Good news, this program is now offered year-round starting Saturday, March 27, from 8 am to 11 am. Be sure to check out all of the details, including what will not be accepted at the landfill, at FrederickCO.gov/CleanUpDays.

SCHOLARSHIP

Do you know a graduating senior that lives in Frederick? The Town of Frederick Scholarship application deadline is approaching! The scholarship is payable at two thousand dollars (\$2,000) per year for the first four years of college. Applications are due no later than April 2 at 5 pm. BURN MITIGATION

Planned and controlled burns will take place this spring to keep areas within the Town healthy. Our Public Work's team and the Frederick-Firestone Fire District's Wildland team have been working closely with the Colorado Division of Fire Prevention and Control to ensure burns are conducted safely. The areas identified include Centennial Park, Bulrush Wetlands, Fox Run, No Name Creek, and Bella Rosa Golf Course. These open areas are essential in filtering and purifying water, promoting healthy soil, and recycling nutrients—all critical aspects for good water quality in the Town of Frederick. The open areas also have tremendous scenic value, provide food and nesting sites for our wildlife, and concealment from predators. We are working toward finalizing the plan and hoping to complete the work in late spring. Burn area maps and updates are at FrederickCO.gov/Burns.

RENT & UTILITY ASSISTANCE

Do you need help paying rent? Weld County Government has received \$9,765,398 to assist eligible county residents struggling to pay their rent and utilities in the wake of COVID-19.
