SLOW THE FLOW

Just like a car, your sprinklers need an occasional check-up! Get your system checked with a FREE sprinkler inspection by the Center for ReSource Conservation and the Town of Frederick by being one of the first 40 Frederick water customers to schedule an inspection. Auditors from the Center for ReSource Conservation will run a few tests to check your sprinklers' efficiency and diagnose any problems your system might have. At the end, you'll receive a customized watering schedule designed to reduce water usage and keep your lawn healthy and beautiful all summer long! Inspections last about 90 minutes, and could help you save thousands of gallons of water each year. It's easy to sign up and get long-lasting and money-saving results! Starting May 30th, simply call (303) 999-3824 or sign up at conservationcenter.org/sprinkler to schedule your inspection. The inspections will be conducted from the middle of June to the middle of September. All available water audits were scheduled by July 6th last year so put May 30th on your calendar! Even if you don't get a sprinkler inspection, it's a good idea to check every spring that your sprinkler system doesn't have any leaks.

STREET SWEEPING SCHEDULE

It's that time of year for our street sweepers to start the cleanup from winter. The Town will make every effort to have our sweepers get to all our subdivisions at least once every 6 weeks. Priorities change quickly with Public Works and to commit to a schedule can be difficult. We ask for understanding and cooperation during the sweeping season. We ask that cars be removed from the street between the hours of 6 a.m. to 3 p.m. during the week your area is scheduled for sweeping, starting May 1st following the order below through October 9th.

- Week of May 1st - Downtown Frederick, Parkview, Maplewood and Coalridge
- Week of May 8th - Countryside, Savannah, Angel View and Carriage Hills
- Week of May 15th - Raspberry Hill, Eagle Valley, Summit View and Fox Run
- Week of May 22nd - The Farm, No Name Creek, and Moore Farm
- Week of May 29th - Morning Side, Wildflower, Wyndham Hill and Rinn Valley
- Week of June 5th - Bear Industrial Park, Frederick West Business Park and Glacier Business Park

TOWN WINS HSIP GRANT

In a partnership with the City of Dacono, we submitted for, and won, funds from the Federal Highway Safety Improvement Program (HSIP) to improve the northbound off-ramp of I-25, where it intersects with the eastbound lanes of Highway 52. The \$436,484 grant will significantly help pay to improve the safety of that intersection, leaving just under \$50,000 for the Town of Frederick and City of Dacono to split to cover the rest of the costs. MOSQUITO ABATEMENT

Mosquito spraying is scheduled to begin in June every Tuesday and Thursday evening, weather permitting. We spray for mosquitos in the evening because it's when the mosquitos are most active, and when the temperature and winds are low enough to make the fogging most effective. SAFE ROUTES TO SCHOOL GRANT

The Colorado Department of Transportation Safe Routes to School program recently awarded the town \$303,500 in grant funding for the completion of the Thunder Valley K8 Multipurpose Trail Project. This eight-foot wide concrete trail will be located on the east side of Ridgeway Boulevard from Angel View Drive to Penrose Boulevard. It will have pedestrian crossings on Ridgeway Boulevard and Frederick Way to allow kids to safely make their way to Thunder Valley K8. The Town will match this grant with approximately \$250,000.
